<p>Hi everyone. In this video, I'm going to show you how to install UserWay widget in HTML and CSS. You must follow all these steps to get the code snippet that you later paste on your site. Some steps are customization options that you can actually skip and go through them later. But in this video, I will show you all of them.</p>	<p>Woman wearing a UserWay shirt is speaking, her video is in a small box in the lower right corner of the screen. <p>Now visit UserWay.org and click on "Get the Widget."</p>	<p>The cursor moves to the upper right corner of the UserWay website and clicks the "Get the Widget" button next to the UserWay icon. Step 1 of the code generation questionnaire appears.</p>
<p>Step number one is, add your website address. Also, don't forget to agree to the terms of service and privacy policy. When you're done, click on "Next."</p>	<p>The example website's URL appears in the "What's your website's address?" window. The cursor clicks the "I agree" checkbox and the "Next" button.</p>
<p>To step number two. And add your name, last name, and your email. Let's continue to step number three – choose your icon.</p>	<p>Step 2 of the questionnaire appears. Sample values appear in these form windows. The cursor clicks the "Next" button in the lower right corner. The form advances to the next page. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>
<p>You can select which icon you want to display on your site. You can choose among these four. Let's continue to step number four.</p>	<p>Step 3 appears. The cursor highlights the four icon choices, leaving the first (default) option selected. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>
<p>Choose the size of your button. No matter which size you choose, mobile devices will always display the smaller size. Now let's click on "Next" to step number five.</p>	<p>Step 4 appears, showing the two icon size choices. The cursor hovers over the smaller icon, then clicks the "Next" button, leaving the larger (default) icon size selected.</p>
<p>You can use this color picker to change the color of your button. Let's click on "Next" to step number six – select the position.</p>	<p>Step 5 appears, showing a spectrum bar and swatch selector. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>
<p>Here you can select where you would like to place your button. There are eight different positions. I'm going to continue to step number seven – select your language.</p>	<p>Step 6 appears, and the cursor highlights some of the possible icon positions around the perimeter of a webpage layout. The cursor clicks the "Next" button, leaving the upper right (default) setting selected.</p>

<p>Default option is letting the widget to automatically detect the language of your visitor. But if you want to force the widget to display in a specific language, then open this list and select yours.</p>	<p>Step 7 appears. The cursor highlights the “Language” field, in which contains the default text, “Auto-Detect Language.” The cursor clicks the dropdown arrow in the “Language” box and a list of languages appears.</p>
<p>Now I’m going to continue to step number eight.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks out of the dropdown menu, restoring the default selection and clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>It’s very important to make your website accessible, but it’s also very important to have an accessibility statement. If you don’t have one, don’t worry about it, because we can help you with that. Just click on “No/I Don’t Know” and we’ll help you with that later. Click on “Next” to step number nine.</p>	<p>Step 8 appears, asking if the user’s site already contains an accessibility statement. “No/I Don’t Know” is the default selection. The cursor clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>If you’re interested in advanced custom options for this widget, then I recommend you to click on “I’d like to learn more” for more information.</p>	<p>The form advances to Step 9, displaying an option to learn more about a white-label or custom-branded version of the UserWay widget. The cursor clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>No I’m going to scroll all the way down to our last step.</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls down to click on the “Next” button.</p>
<p>Here’s your code. So, click on “Copy,” and I’ll show you now where to paste this code on your HTML files.</p>	<p>Step 10 appears, showing a window containing the UserWay script. The cursor clicks on the “Copy” button in the window’s upper right corner. The code is highlighted.</p>
<p>So, these are all the files on the website. The code is copied to my clipboard, so I’m going to show you where you have to paste the code.</p>	<p>The screen transitions to a list of files on the example websites.</p>
<p>We have to paste the code in each one of these HTML files.</p>	<p>The cursor highlights the HTML files in the list.</p>
<p>So, first I’m going to preview one of the pages. Let’s select “about.html.” We still haven’t installed a widget. I’m going to go back to the folder.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the “about.html” file. The page loads. The cursor closes the page and the file listing reappears.</p>

<p>So, I'm gonna open this file with a text editor.</p>	<p>The cursor right-clicks the "about.html" file. The "Open With" menu opens, and the cursor selects a text editor program. The code page opens.</p>
<p>And here, just scroll all the way down. And let's find the body closing tag. Here it is.</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls to the end of the code and highlights the </body> tag.</p>
<p>Just get some space.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks enter a few times to enter blank lines above the body closing tag.</p>
<p>Here's where you have to paste the code.</p>	<p>The cursor in the first blank line and pastes the code.</p>
<p>So, just remember to save it. Save this file.</p>	<p>The file list page appears.</p>
<p>And now, I'm going to open this file again, OK?</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "about.html" file. The "About Us" page opens.</p>
<p>And here's our widget. I'm going to open another HTML file.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks on the UserWay widget icon in the upper right. The Accessibility menu opens.</p>
<p>Let's click on "Contact Us," OK? Double-click, and as you can see, the widget is not here.</p>	<p>The example site's "Contact Us" page appears.</p>
<p>So, that's why you have to paste the code in every single HTML file.</p>	<p>The cursor right-clicks the "contact.html" file. The "Open With" menu opens, and the cursor selects a text editor program. The code page opens.</p>
<p>Same thing. I'm going to scroll all the way down till I find the body closing tag.</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls to the end of the code and highlights the </body> tag. The cursor clicks enter a few times to enter blank lines above the body closing tag.</p>
<p>Here's where I paste the code. I'm going to save the file.</p>	<p>The cursor in the first blank line and pastes the code.</p>
<p>And now I'm going to preview it. Once you're done pasting the code on all your HTML files, remember to upload your site to your server. If you can see the widget on your site, that means you have done everything correctly.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the Contact Us file. The Contact Us page opens, displaying the UserWay widget icon.</p>
<p>But in case you want to double-check, there's another way to verify this installation. Let's go back to UserWay.org and I'll show you how to do it.</p>	<p>Step 10 of the code-acquisition form appears with the code snipped highlighted.</p>

<p>Here you can click on “Let’s Verify” button to make sure that you have installed the widget correctly. But, again, if you can see the widget on your site, that means that everything is OK.</p>	<p>The cursor highlights the “Let’s Verify” button.</p>
<p>So, what we can do now is click on “Skip.” And here’s your accessibility statement. This is a template that we’re sharing with you that you can copy, you can add your own details, customize it as you want, and bring it on your site.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the “Skip: button. The Accessibility Statement appears.</p>
<p>If you want to learn how to install UserWay widget in other platforms like Squarespace, Webflow, WordPress, and many more, you can follow the videos that you can see on your screen right now.
