<p>Hi everyone. In this video, I'm going to show you how to install UserWay widget in PrestaShop. You must follow all the steps to get the code snippet that you later paste on your site. Some steps are customization options that you can actually skip and go through them later. But in this video, I will show you all of the steps.</p>	<p>Woman wearing a UserWay shirt is speaking, her video is in a small box in the lower right corner of the screen. <p>Let's start by visiting userway.org and click on "Get the Widget."</p>	<p>The cursor moves to the upper right corner of the UserWay website and clicks the "Get the Widget" button next to the UserWay icon. Step 1 of the code generation questionnaire appears.</p>
<p>Step number one is, add your website address. Also, don't forget to agree to the terms of service and privacy policy. Click on "Next" to step number two.</p>	<p>The example website's URL appears in the "What's your website's address?" window. The cursor clicks the "I agree" checkbox and the "Next" button.</p>
<p>Add your name, last name, and your email. Click on "Next" to step number three.</p>	<p>Step 2 of the questionnaire appears. Sample values appear in these form windows. The cursor clicks the "Next" button in the lower right corner. The form advances to the next page. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>
<p>Here you can select the icon that you want to display. You can choose among these four icons. Click on "Next" to step number four: Choose the size.</p>	<p>Step 3 appears. The cursor highlights the four icon choices, leaving the first (default) option selected. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>
<p>No matter which size you choose, mobile devices will always display the smaller size. Click on "Next" to step number 5.</p>	<p>Step 4 appears, showing the two icon size choices. The cursor hovers over the smaller icon, then clicks the "Next" button, leaving the larger (default) icon size selected.</p>
<p>Here you can change the color of your button, so it matches rest of your site. Click on "Next" to step number six.</p>	<p>Step 5 appears, showing a spectrum bar and swatch selector. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>

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<p>Choose the position of your button. You have eight different positions, so select your preferred one. Click on “Next” to step number seven.</p>	<p>Step 6 appears, showing the eight possible icon positions around the perimeter of a webpage layout. The cursor clicks the “Next” button, leaving the upper right (default) setting selected.</p>
<p>You have two options here. Default option is letting the widget to automatically detect the language of your visitor. Or, if you want to force the widget to display in a specific language, then open this list and select your language.</p>	<p>Step 7 appears. The cursor highlights the “Language” field, in which contains the default text, “Auto-Detect Language.” The cursor clicks the dropdown arrow in the “Language” box and a list of languages appears.</p>
<p>Click on “Next” to step number eight.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks out of the dropdown menu, restoring the default selection and clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>You’re already making your site accessible, but you also need an accessibility statement. If you don’t have one, we can help you with that. Just leave “No/I don’t know” selected, and we will help you with that later. Now let’s click on “Next” to step number nine.</p>	<p>Step 8 appears, asking if the user’s site already contains an accessibility statement. “No/I Don’t Know” is the default selection. The cursor clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>If you’re interested in advanced custom options for this widget, then I recommend you to click on “I’d like to learn more” for more information.</p>	<p>The form advances to Step 9, displaying an option to learn more about a white-label or custom-branded version of the UserWay widget.</p>
<p>Now I’m going to scroll down to click on “Next” to the last step.</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls down to the “Next” button and clicks it.</p>
<p>And here is our code. Let’s click on “Copy,” and I’ll see you in PrestaShop.</p>	<p>Step 10 appears, showing a window containing the UserWay script. The cursor clicks on the “Copy” button in the window’s upper right corner. The code is highlighted.</p>
<p>I’m in PrestaShop back-end. Code is copied to my clipboard. And now I’m going to show you where to paste this code.</p>	<p>The screen transitions to the example site’s PrestaShop management page.</p>

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<p>To add your custom code in PrestaShop, you need a module. In this tutorial, I'm going to use a free module called "HTML Box." Once you upload this module, you have to configure it. So, let's do that. To find the module that you have installed, on the left menu click "Module Manager," and scroll all the way down.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks "Module Manager" from the menu on the left side of the page. The cursor scrolls down the "Module Manager" page to "HTML Box."</p>
<p>And when you find "HTML Box," click on "Configure."</p>	<p>The cursor clicks "Configure." The Configure window appears.</p>
<p>Scroll down, and here we get some instructions: [reading from site] If you want to use a script track, remember to disable HTML purifier. So, let's make sure it is disabled.</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls to the "JavaScript Usage" section.</p>
<p>So, let's make sure it is disabled. You can find this on the left menu, all the way down in "Shop Parameters." Go to "General." I'm going to open this in a new tab.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "Shop Parameters" item under "Configure" in the menu on the left of the page. It then clicks the "General" option. The "General" menu opens on the screen.</p>
<p>And make sure...Here it is: "Use HTML Purifier Library." Right now, it's disabled. So, just make sure you've done this step.</p>	<p>The cursor highlights the "Use HTML Purifier Library" item. "No" is selected.</p>
<p>I'm going to go back to the module.</p>	<p>The cursor closes the "General" menu window and the "Configure HTML Box" screen appears.</p>
<p>And here is where we have to paste the code.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks inside the "Enter the Code Here" panel.</p>
<p>Let's click on "Source Code." And here's where we paste our site.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "Source Code" icon above the panel. The Source Code window appears. The cursor pastes the code into the window.</p>
<p>Click on "OK."</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "OK" button.</p>
<p>Also, gonna scroll down a little bit and also scroll to the right, because we have our "Save" button a little bit hidden. Click on "Save."</p>	<p>The cursor scrolls to the "Save" button and clicks it.</p>
<p>And now, let's preview our site.</p>	<p>The screen transitions to the sample website</p>

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<p>Here's our widget. If you can see the widget, that means that you have done everything correctly.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the UserWay widget icon in the upper right. The Accessibility menu appears.</p>
<p>But also, there's another way to verify this installation. Let's go back to userway.org, and I'll show you how to do it. Here you can click on "Let's Verify" to check the installation.</p>	<p>The screen returns to the UserWay site page with the script highlighted in Step 10. The cursor highlights the "Let's Verify" button.</p>
<p>But, again, if you can see the widget, that means that you have set up everything correctly. So, what you can do is click on "Skip," and here's your accessibility statement. This is a template that we're sharing with you. You can copy it, add your own details, customize it as you want, and paste it on your site.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "Skip" button next to "Let's Verify." A page appears, displaying an accessibility statement.</p>
