<p>Hi everyone. In this tutorial I'm going to show you how to install UserWay widget in Weebly. So, visit userway.org. and click on "Get the Widget."</p>	<p>Woman wearing a UserWay shirt is speaking, her video is in a small box in the lower right corner of the screen. <p>You will need to follow all steps to get the code that you will later paste on your Weebly site. Some steps are customizations options that you can actually skip and go through them later. But in this tutorial, all will show you all the steps.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the "Get the Widget button" in the upper right of the website, next to the UserWay Icon. Step 1 of the code generation questionnaire appears with the example website's URL appears in the "What's your website's address?" window.</p>
<p>So, step number one is, add your website address. And don't forget to agree to all the terms and privacy policy. Click on "Next."</p>	<p>The cursor pastes the example site's URL into the window, and then clicks the "I agree" checkbox and the "Next" button. Step 2 of the questionnaire appears.</p>
<p>Step number two, add your name, last name, and your email. Let's continue to step number three...</p>	<p>Sample values appear in these form windows. The cursor clicks the "Next" button in the lower right corner. The form advances to the next page. The cursor clicks the "Next" button. Step 3 appears.</p>
<p>...where you will select your icon type. You choose among the four icons. Continue to step number four.</p>	<p>The cursor highlights the four icon choices, leaving the first (default) option selected. The cursor clicks the "Next" button. Step 4 appears, showing the two icon size choices.</p>
<p>In this step, you can choose the size of the button. No matter which size you choose, mobile devices will always display this smaller size.</p>	<p>The cursor hovers over the smaller icon, then clicks the "Next" button, leaving the larger (default) icon size selected.</p>
<p>Let's continue to step number 5. And in this step, you can customize the color of your button. Let's continue to step number six...</p>	<p>Step 5 appears, showing a spectrum bar and swatch selector. The cursor clicks the "Next" button.</p>

<p>...where you will select the position of your button. There are eight different positions, so just click over your preferred one.</p>	<p>Step 6 appears, and the cursor highlights some of the possible icon positions around the perimeter of a webpage layout. The cursor clicks the “Next” button, leaving the upper right (default) setting selected.</p>
<p>Continue to step number seven to choose your preferred language. You can leave it on “auto-detect language” so the widget will automatically detect the language of the visitor. But if you want to force the widget to display a specific language, you can select yours from this list over here.</p>	<p>Step 7 appears. The cursor highlights the “Language” field, in which contains the default text, “Auto-Detect Language.” The cursor clicks the dropdown arrow in the “Language” box and a list of languages appears.</p>
<p>Let’s continue to step number eight. As it is very important to make your site accessible, it’s also important to have an accessibility statement. If you don’t have one, don’t worry about it. Just remember to leave “No” selected, and we will help you with that later on. Now we continue to step number nine.</p>	<p>Step 8 appears, asking if the user’s site already contains an accessibility statement. “No/I Don’t Know” is the default selection. The cursor clicks the “Next” button. The cursor clicks out of the dropdown menu, restoring the default selection and clicks the “Next” button.</p>
<p>If you’re interested in advanced custom options for this widget, then I’ll strongly recommend you to select “I’d like to learn more” for more information. Now let’s scroll down to the last step, where we will get our code.</p>	<p>The form advances to Step 9, displaying an option to learn more about a white-label or custom-branded version of the UserWay widget. The cursor clicks the “I’d Like to Learn More” button. The cursor scrolls down to click the “Next” button. Step 10 appears, showing a window containing the UserWay script.</p>
<p>Here it is. the code. Just click on “Copy” and let’s go to Weebly.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks on the “Copy” button in the window’s upper right corner. The code is highlighted.</p>
<p>I’m in Weebly website editor, and the code is copied to my clipboard. So, go to “Settings.”</p>	<p>The screen transitions to the example site’s Weebly editor page. The cursor clicks on the “Settings” tab in the top menu bar. The “Settings” menu appears on the left.</p>
<p>And click on “SEO” tab.</p>	<p>The “cursor clicks “SEO.” The SEO window appears.</p>

<p>And here in “Footer Code,” paste the code. Don’t forget to click on “Save.” And you’re done.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks in the “Footer Code” section of the window and pastes the code. The cursor clicks the “Save” button in the lower right corner.</p>
<p>Now let’s click on “Publish.” And let’s visit the site and check if we’ve installed it correctly.</p>	<p>The cursor clicks the “Publish” button in the upper right. The Publishing...Website Published” message appears.</p>
<p>If you see the widget this means that everything is OK. So, here it is. Here is our widget.</p>	<p>The example website appears. The cursor clicks the UserWay widget icon in the upper right. The “Accessibility” menu appears.</p>
<p>You can also verify the installation from userway.org. I’m gonna go back to the page.</p>	<p>Step 10 from the installation process appears, showing the snippet highlighted in the code window.</p>
<p>You can click this button to verify the installation, although if you already see the widget on your site, that means that the installation has been done correctly. So, what you can do is skip, and you get your accessibility statement.</p>	<p>The cursor highlights the “Let’s Verify” button. The cursor clicks the “Skip” button next to “Let’s Verify.”</p>
<p>Here’s a template that you can modify as you like and copy it into your website.</p>	<p>The accessibility statement appears.</p>
<p>If you want to learn how to install UserWay widget in other platforms like SquareSpace, Webflow, WordPress, and many more, you can follow the videos that you can see on your screen right now.
